

SOL LEWITT

Sol LeWitt, who was born in Connecticut in 1928, is one of the most influential artists alive today. In the catalog for his 1978 retrospective at New York's Museum of Modern Art, Curator Bernice Rose says that his innovative work drawing directly on walls "was as important for drawing as Pollock's use of the drip technique had been for painting in the 1950s." A more recent retrospective was organized in 2000 by the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, and traveled to the Whitney Museum of American Art.

LeWitt is known mainly as a sculptor and draftsman—his large-scale wall drawings are in place all over the world—but he is also a dedicated printmaker, and works in all the print media. He began his association with Crown Point Press in 1972—he was the first artist from New York to work at Crown Point. We are pleased to present here some new etchings, a small oasis of calm in a turbulent world.












